

Required Data Fields to Approve/Sign off the plan - To support the patient care response by urgent care	Method used to record item - Designed for efficient fill-in
Consent type & date	Radio button to select and date selector.
Main diagnosis (other relevant diagnoses if relevant)	Drop down (& freetext only if useful to share).
WHO performance status & date	Radio button to select and date selector.
Prognosis – Years to days & date and name of clinician who has indicated time frame	Drop down, date selector and freetext name (additional freetext only if useful to share).
Patient place of care preference - deterioration	Radio button to select (not yet discussed available - freetext only if useful to share).
Patient place of care preference – end of life	Radio button to select (not yet discussed available - freetext only if useful to share).
CPR discussion with Patient – Yes/No, content & date	Drop down, freetext, date selector.
CPR discussion with family – Yes/No, content & date	Drop down, freetext, date selector.
CPR Decision – Yes/No/Decision Not Yet Made	Drop down.
If CPR decision is No – how will you substantiate?	Drop down.
If No – 8 items from the Standard DNACPR form	Drop downs x 3, Dates x 2, Freetext x 1, Names x 2
Clinical Recommendation (level of medical intervention)	Radio button to select (& freetext only if useful).
Medication - Allergy	Dropdown (& freetext only if useful to share).
Next Review Date and Reviewer	Date selector & name search (choose upto a year)

**Tip:** In a time pressured scenario – navigate care plan screens looking for **red dot/asterisk/text** to locate & engage with all **'required'** data fields. **Red** dots in section menu go green - you can approve.

**Non-required but key information: normal baseline, expected symptoms & management, what would help pt. stay at home, where are any anticipatory medications located? What is family understanding?**
